
The Crowd: Another year CHOC-ful of follies

The CHOC Follies recently wrapped up its 15th annual production, "Christina and the Crystal Ball: A Cinderella Story for the Social Net Set." It was a four-show run that played to some 2,300 cheering fans at Orange Coast College's Robert B. Moore Theatre in Costa Mesa



This year's production raised an estimated \$500,000 to support construction of The Voice, a project of the Ryan Seacrest Foundation at Children's Hospital of Orange County. The Voice will enable patients at CHOC to engage in creative activities while being confined to the hospital for treatment.

To date, the Follies have netted nearly \$6 million in support of CHOC.

Executive Producer Gloria Zigner joined her dedicated event chairs — Leslie Cancellieri, Sandy Segerstrom Daniels and Dale Skiles — along with Associate Producer Lois Augustine, who was representing the CHOC Children's Foundation, in taking a bow at the final curtain with the production's creative staff of John Vaughan, Doug Austin and Lee Martino.


